

2022 Iowa Radon Poster Contest

Opportunity for Students

Radon is a colorless, odorless, tasteless, radioactive gas produced by the natural decay of uranium in the soil. Exposure to elevated radon levels increases the risk of developing lung cancer. Radon is the leading cause of lung cancer among non-smokers and is the number one cause of death in homes, surpassing falls, poisoning, fires, choking, and drowning. As all lowa counties are considered at high risk, this contest provides an opportunity to educate lowa youth and the general public. By participating in this activity, students will learn about radon and how to reduce their risk of exposure.

In order to spread the message about radon's health hazards, the American Lung Association and the lowa Department of Public Health, in partnership with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region 7 and the lowa Radon Coalition host the annual statewide **lowa Radon Poster Contest**. We are once again calling on lowa citizens **ages 9-14** to create a radon poster that will increase public awareness of radon gas and encourage others to test their homes. A committee will select the top five winning posters from throughout the entire state of lowa to receive awards:

1st place winner will receive \$300

2nd place winner will receive \$200

3rd place winner will receive \$150

4th place winner will receive \$100

5th place winner will receive \$50

The school with the most entries will receive \$200!

Poster Guidelines

Poster topics:

- What is radon?
- Where does radon come from?
- How does radon get into our homes?
- Radon can cause lung cancer
- Test your home for radon

What the judges are looking for:

- Accuracy of poster content
- Correct spelling
- Reproducibility of poster
- Originality of poster
 (Does not resemble a past winner)
- Poster is aesthetically pleasing

Requirements:

- Age 9-14
- Enrolled in a public, private, territorial, tribal DoD, or home school or part of a sponsored club like scouts or 4H
- Be original
- Student's name is not on the front
- Topic and title must be on the Artwork Submission Form (1 copy included!)
- White paper 12 x 18 and 8.5 x 11 sizes are preferred, but all sizes will be accepted
- Can be created with crayon, markers, paint, collage, photographs or computer graphics
- Lettering and message should be large enough to reproduce well.
- All pencil markings erased
- Copyrighted characters, product logos and trademarked or brand names cannot be used
